Program shown in <i>italic</i> on Trail camp days are not listed in the <i>TREKS</i> booklet, but the itinerary passes near or through a Staffed camp with program. Programs shown in <i>italic</i> at Staffed camps are not listed in the <i>TREKS</i> booklet for that particular itinerary (horse rides being the sole exception - listed only if included in <i>TREKS</i>). Dinners in <i>italic</i> are not listed in the <i>TREKS</i> booklet, but are noted as one less meal in the "menu no." column. Elevations are from a posting of GPS coordinates for Philmont camps by R.
